**TASER® Foundation Awards Memorial Grants to the Families of Three
Indiana Officers Lost in the Line of Duty**

**TASER Foundation was established with \$ 1 million donated by
TASER International, Inc. and personally by its employees**

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz., December 2, 2004 – TASER Foundation, a new non-profit foundation to honor fallen law enforcement officers and provide one time financial grants to their families announced today that it awarded memorial grants to the families of three Indiana law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. TASER International President Tom Smith and Steve Tuttle, Vice President of Communications will present the memorial grants to Indianapolis Police Chief Jerry Barker and Chief David Selby of the Butler University Police Department during a ceremony at Indianapolis PD headquarters at 4:00 PM .

Indianapolis Police Officer Timothy Laird was shot and killed on August 18, 2004 while responding to a disturbance call. Officer **James Davis of the Butler University Police Department** was fatally shot inside the Hinkle Fieldhouse while investing a suspicious person on September 24, 2004. **Newton County Deputy Sheriff Craig Blann** was electrocuted while investigating an automobile accident on September 6, 2004.

“The holidays are going to be hard enough on these families, we hope that in some small way these grants help them begin to rebuild their lives,” said Gerry Anderson, Executive Director of the TASER Foundation.

“Indianapolis Police Department is grateful to the TASER Foundation for their support,” stated by Chief Jerry Barker Indianapolis Police Department. “Their assistance to the families of officers recently lost in the line of duty means more than I can say. As law enforcement professionals, we also value our professional partnership and their efforts to make law enforcement safer. We welcome any technological advance that can resolve physical confrontations with reduced chance of serious injury, either to our officers or the public we serve.”

In 2003, 145 law enforcement officers in the United States and 11 law enforcement officers in Canada were killed in the line of duty. “TASER International works in partnership with American and Canadian law enforcement agencies to enhance the safety

of our officers and the general public,” said Tom Smith, President of TASER International, Inc. “We are pleased to expand this partnership in a way that honors the sacrifice of these brave men and women. In addition, we have developed the TASER Foundation web page at www.TASERFoundation.org,” continued Mr. Smith.

The TASER Foundation will distribute financial memorial grants to the families of fallen officers in the United States and Canada through donations and an initial endowment of \$1,000,000. Over half of the initial endowment came in direct contribution from TASER International employees with the balance contributed by the company. Grants are available only upon request by chiefs of police and sheriffs as well as federal law enforcement executives in the name of sworn officers killed in the line of duty since August 1, 2004. The TASER Foundation’s mission is to honor the service and sacrifice of local and federal law enforcement officers in the United States and Canada lost in the line of duty by providing financial support to their families. TASER International will bear all of the administrative costs of the TASER Foundation in order to ensure 100 percent of all donations are distributed to the families of fallen officers,” concluded Mr. Smith.
